CPC30220 Certificate III in Carpentry

Co-Contribution Fee Sheet

1 FULL FEE (Co-Contribution)

Fees are charged at \$1.60 per nominal hour for each unit of competency/module.

- Co-contribution fees are set by the Department.
- Co-contribution fees must be calculated at the commencement of each unit or module.
- The Co-contribution fee applies consistently across all Skills Assure Suppliers delivering apprenticeships and traineeships.

2 PARTIAL FEE EXEMPTION (Co-Contribution)

40 per cent of the fees are charged where the participant falls into one or more of the following exemption categories:

- The participant was or will be under 17 years of age at the end of February in the year in which the SAS provides training and is not at school and has not completed year 12.
- The participant holds a Health Care, Veteran or Pensioner Concession Card issued under Commonwealth law, or is the partner or a dependant of a person who holds such a card and is named on the card.
- Holds an official form issued under Commonwealth law confirming that the individual, their partner or the person of whom they are a dependant, is entitled to concessions under a Health Care, Veteran or Pensioner Concession Card.
- The participant identifies as Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander.

3 FULL FEE EXEMPTION (Co-Contribution)

No fees are charged where the participant falls into one or more of the following categories:

- A credit transfer applies to a unit of competency/module.
- Transitional gap training applies when transitioning an apprentice/trainee from a superseded qualification or unit of competency where a previously completed unit of competency is identified as similar but not equivalent.
- The participant is a school-based apprentice or trainee.
- The participant is under 25 years of age at the commencement of their apprenticeship/traineeship.

4 PACKAGING RULES

To be awarded the **CPC30220 Certificate III in Carpentry**, 34 units of competency must be achieved, chosen as outlined below:

- 27 core units
- 7 electives
- A minimum of 5 elective units of competency must be selected from Group A.
- The remaining elective units of competency can be selected from Group A or Group B.
- A maximum of 2 units of competency can be selected from any group or current training package, if it contributes to a valid, industry-supported vocational outcome and maintains the AQF level of this qualification.
