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Introduction

Thank you for expressing an interest in the short course, which comprises the unit of competency *CPCBC4001A Apply building codes and standards to the construction process for low rise building projects*.

To successfully construct low rise buildings requires:

- ✓ a thorough knowledge of the purpose and content of the Building Code of Australia (BCA) and
- ✓ the ability to interpret other codes and standards related to a specific building.

This course specifies the outcomes required to access, interpret and apply relevant building codes and standards applicable to the construction processes of residential and low-rise commercial buildings (low rise' licensing classification with reference to Class 1 and 10 construction and Classes 2 to 9 with a gross floor area not exceeding 2000 square metres, not including Type A or Type B construction).

This course supports builders, site managers and related construction industry professionals responsible for ensuring compliance with building codes and standards in the residential and commercial construction industry.

The training you will undertake for this course is nationally accredited training. On successful completion of the course, a Statement of Attainment will be issued to you through Blue Dog Training.

This unit of competency may also be used as a core unit in the qualification *CPC40110 - Certificate IV in Building and Construction (Building)*.

Please take time to read the information in this document as it is very important you select the right course for you.

Course Details

The Blue Dog Training flexible course structure allows you to fit your study into your work, family and social commitments.

Completion of the course will require you to:

- ✓ Undertake directed self-paced research and study
- ✓ Complete and submit the assessment activities outlined in the Assessment Workbook developed for this unit of competency
- ✓ Undertake an assessment conversation with a Blue Dog Training assessor.

Under fee-for service arrangements you can commence your course at any time throughout the year. Under industry funding arrangements the timelines for enrolment and completion are linked to the funding cycle which applies to your enrolment. These details will be explained to you prior to acceptance of your enrolment.

The length of the course is 40 nominal hours. It is expected you will complete the course within four (4) to six (6) weeks from enrolment.

You have a maximum of three (3) submission attempts to successfully complete the assessment activities for this course. If you are not deemed competent after the third attempt, you will be required to re-enrol in the program.

Resources



Resources you will require for the course are:

- ✓ computer and printer
- ✓ internet access for research and information, including:
 - access to the Building Code of Australia (BCA) and documents referenced in the BCA
 - access to relevant legislation, for example Building Act 1975 (Queensland)
- ✓ access and application of Adobe Acrobat pdf reader is essential. Excel or similar software is not essential; however, it may be beneficial to the learner during self-directed research activities to process and manage information
- ✓ commitment and environment conducive to self-paced study.

Authenticity of Assessment

The assessment work you submit as evidence of your knowledge, skills and experience must be completed by you and not anyone else. BDT's assessment judgement processes will enable this authenticity to be confirmed through the final discussion that a BDT Trainer and Assessor will have with you once your assessment evidence has been submitted and reviewed.

This discussion takes the form of a 'competency conversation' and is designed to confirm, through open-ended questions, how you have applied your knowledge and skills related to the evidence you have provided. Once it has been conducted it enables the BDT assessor to make their professional judgement knowing that all of the 'Rules of Evidence' have been applied.

Training Costs

The cost of your course will depend on whether your training and assessment is being subsidised by Construction Skills Queensland (CSQ) or if you are undertaking the course on a fee-for-service basis.

To be eligible for subsidised training (that is, for CSQ to contribute to the cost of your training and assessment services) you will need to meet the eligibility criteria determined by CSQ.

Places for CSQ subsidised training are limited and available on a 'first come first served' basis.

1. Fee-For Service

The cost of this course under fee-for-service arrangements is **\$340**. This amount must be paid at enrolment.

2. Construction Skills Queensland Subsidy



There are two funding sources for this course available through Construction Skills Queensland.

2.1 Short Courses (General Construction) Program

The CSQ Short Courses (General Construction) Program provides funding for the skilling and cross skilling of eligible workers in the building and construction industry.

What this means is:

- ✓ If you are currently working in the Queensland building and construction industry you may be eligible to have your course subsidized by CSQ through a contribution to the cost of your training and assessment services; and



- ✓ If you are eligible CSQ will contribute **\$240** towards the cost of your course, reducing your student fee to **\$100**; and
- ✓ The \$100 student fee must be paid at enrolment:

Participant Eligibility

For the purpose of eligibility, participants must meet the following criteria:

1. MUST BE:

- a) An Existing Worker; and
- b) An Eligible Worker; or
- c) An Unemployed Eligible Worker.

2. AND MUST BE:

- e) An Australian or New Zealand citizen; or
- f) A permanent resident of Australia; or
- g) A refugee and humanitarian visa holder.

3. AND MUST:

- h) Permanently reside in Queensland; or
- i) Be permanently employed in Queensland.

2.2 Apprentice Advance Plus – Short Courses (General Construction) Program

The CSQ Apprentice Advance Plus – Short Courses (General Construction) program is targeted to apprentices (and trainees) during their apprenticeship (or Traineeship) and in the first year following completion of their apprenticeship or (Traineeship).

The program is designed to assist apprentices (and trainees) to undertake further skills training, to assist them to be competitive in the market, and gain licenses essential to future work.

Under this program CSQ provides a subsidy of **\$300** which will cover the full cost of training and assessment services. There are no additional student fees to be paid.



Participant Eligibility

For the purpose of eligibility, participants must meet the following criteria:

1. **MUST BE:**

- a) An Australian or New Zealand citizen; or
- b) A permanent resident of Australia; or
- c) A refugee and humanitarian visa holder.

2. **AND MUST**

- d) Permanently reside in Queensland; or
- e) Be permanently employed in Queensland.

3. **AND MUST BE:**

- f) A current active Apprentice (or Trainee) in Queensland undertaking a Recognised Apprenticeship (or Traineeship), or
- g) An Existing Worker or Unemployed Eligible Worker in the first year out of their Recognised Apprenticeship (or Traineeship) who must commence training within 365 days of the completion date in DELTA; or
- h) A cancelled Apprentice (or Trainee) who was undertaking a Recognised Apprenticeship or Traineeship that has been cancelled and they are currently accessing State Government funding to complete their institution - based training; or
- i) A current active Apprentice or Trainee in Queensland undertaking a Recognised Apprenticeship (or Traineeship) who is working on a major project; or
- j) An Existing Worker in the first year out of their recognised Apprenticeship (or Traineeship) who must commence training within 365 days of the completion date in DELTA who is working on a major Project.

Construction Skills Queensland – Short Courses (General Construction) Program

Non eligible participant under the Program

- a) An Employee of any Authority (excluding employees of an Indigenous Council that is a Principal Contractor).
- b) Eligible under the Apprentice Advance Plus Program as:
 - i. A current active apprentice or trainee in Queensland as defined by the Act who is undertaking a Recognised Apprenticeship or Traineeship
 - ii. An Existing Worker or Unemployed Eligible Worker in the first year out of their Recognised Apprenticeship or Traineeship who must commence training within 365 days of the completion date in DELTA; or
 - iii. A cancelled apprentice or trainee who was undertaking a Recognised Apprenticeship or Traineeship that has been cancelled and are currently access State Government funding to complete their institution-based training.
- c) Currently enrolled and participating in a Queensland secondary school program (excluding a school based Apprentice or Trainee);
- d) A contracted trainer or assessor or existing worker of an RTO;
- e) Previously funded under this Program for eight (8) Short Courses – General Construction in the same Contract Term;
- f) Funded by an Authority or such other source for the delivery of the same Training being undertaken as part of this Program;
- g) Those Participants seeking a Verification of Competency (or Determination of Competency) services; or
- h) Other individuals that do not meet Participant Eligibility as outlined in this document.

Construction Skills Queensland – Apprentice Advance Plus – Short Courses (General Construction) Program

Non eligible participant under the Program

- a) An Employee of any Authority (excluding employees of an Indigenous Council that is a Principal Contractor).
- b) Currently enrolled and participating in a Queensland secondary school program (excluding a school-based Apprentice or Trainee);
- c) A contracted trainer or assessor or existing worker of an RTO;
- d) Funded by an Authority or such other source for the delivery of the same Training being undertaken as part of this Program;
- e) Those participants seeking a Verification of Competency (or determination of Competency) services or
- f) Other individuals that do not meet Participant Eligibility as outlined in this document.
