The training you will undertake for this course is nationally accredited training. On successful completion of the course, a Statement of Attainment will be issued to you through Blue Dog Training.

Completion of the course will allow you to apply for a Queensland Building and Construction Commission (QBCC) Trade Contractor Licence or Nominee Supervisor Licence.

Please take time to read the information in this document as it is very important you select the right course for you.

Course Details

The Blue Dog Training flexible on-line course allows you to fit your study into your work, family and social commitments. You work through the course at your own pace, downloading the workbook and other resources from our website. A trainer is available to support you every step of the way.

The course consists of four components:

- Structure and financials
- Legal
- Bookkeeping
- Sales

These are designed so that you complete them sequentially. For each component, there is a learner resource video available designed to support your learning and knowledge development.

There is a final project that you will download, complete and return to Blue Dog Training for assessment. This project includes creating a Safe Work Method Statement (SWMS), a business budget and completing Business Activity Statements (BAS). This will help you understand how to create credibility with clients and keep your ideas fresh and relevant within the construction industry, no matter your trade.

You are able to commence this course at any time throughout the year. The length of the course is 60 nominal hours. You have two months in which to complete the course.



Resources

Resources you will require for the course are:

- ✓ access to a computer, printer and internet
- ✓ an in-built or external webcam (optional) - Please note, cameras on iPads/tablets are not compatible
- ✓ workbook and cashflow document which you will be able to access through your on-line course.

Training Costs

The cost of your course will depend on whether or not your training is being subsidised through Construction Skills Queensland (CSQ) or if you are undertaking the course on a fee-for-service basis. To be eligible for subsidised training, you will need to meet eligibility criteria determined by CSQ.

Places for subsidised training are limited and available on a 'first come first served' basis.

1. CSQ – Short Courses General Construction program

As a CSQ Registered Training Supplier (RTS), Blue Dog Training is proud to be able to offer this course under the CSQ Short Courses General Construction program.

This program is targeted to existing workers in the building and construction industry. If you are currently working in the Queensland building and construction industry, you may be eligible for CSQ funding to undertake this course. Eligible participants under this program:

- a) must be
 - an existing worker*in the building and construction industry and
 - an eligible worker**
 - an unemployed eligible worker***
- b) and must be
 - an Australian or New Zealand citizen; or
 - a permanent resident of Australia; or
 - a holder of a refugee or humanitarian visa
- c) and must
 - permanently reside in Queensland; or
 - be permanently employed in Queensland
- d) and must not be
 - an employee of any authority; or
 - currently enrolled and participating in a school program; or
 - contracted trainers and assessors or existing workers of any RTO; or
 - already funded by an Authority or other such source for the delivery of the same training being undertaken as part of this program; or
 - previously been funded under this program in the same program period.

*An **existing worker** is a current employee in the Building and Construction Industry who has a one month or more employment relationship with their employer. The working relationship can be built up through full-time, part-time or casual employment or engagement as a contract worker.

An **eligible worker has the same meaning as the *Building and Construction Industry (Portable Long Service Leave) Act 1991*.

***An **unemployed eligible worker** is a person who has been unemployed for a period of no greater than 6 months that would otherwise meet the requirements of eligible worker.

If you are eligible for funding, CSQ will contribute up to \$360 towards the cost of your course, reducing your student fee to \$100. This student fee amount must be paid on enrolment.

2. Fee-for-Service

Under fee-for-service arrangements, the full cost of the course is \$460. This amount must be paid in full at the time of enrolment.

How do I make payment for my training?

Payment can be made via Direct Deposit or Credit Card. Further details are available on the enrolment form.

How do I enrol?

Once you have made your decision, you will need to complete an enrolment form which is available on our website.

Before you enrol, you must read the Blue Dog Training Student Handbook which is available on our website. This Student Handbook provides information about the training services, procedures and policies of Blue Dog Training. As part of the enrolment process, you will be asked to agree to abide by these policies and procedures.
